There are now only a couple of weeks left until pupils go on study leave. I thought it important to let you know some details about this and some other information that you may find useful:

- Study Leave for Year 11 begins on Friday 28th May 2010. Pupils will be expected to attend school on that day as normal. During the afternoon there will be a leaver's assembly as a celebration of their 5 years at Tytherington. Pupils will then leave as normal and be able to catch the school bus home should they wish to. From that point on pupils will only be expected to come into school should they have an exam OR a revision session.
- During the next two weeks, **and** after half term, a program of revision sessions has been organised for all pupils. Prior to each exam, pupils will attend a one or two hour session in that subject. Typically, if they have an exam in the afternoon the revision session will operate in the morning. For exams in the morning the session will take place during the previous afternoon's lessons. Pupils should make sure that they bring appropriate materials and work to make the most of these sessions. A reminder from you would probably be helpful. A copy of the timetable for these sessions is attached.
- The money for the School Prom needs to be in by the end of this school week please. The cost is £29. Cheques made payable to: 'Tytherington High School'.

Pupils have been reminded today of the following high expectations that we have of them:

- School uniform **MUST** be worn for revision sessions and exams. Pupils will not be allowed to join revision sessions or sit exams if they are not dressed appropriately.
- All pupils must abide by the exam room rules. Exams are staffed by trained invigilators whose job it is to ensure that these rules are followed. Should they be caught communicating with other pupils in any way they risk disqualification from the exam they are sitting and future exams.
- Mobile phones should not be taken to their seat in an exam room regardless of if they are on silent or turned off. Leave them at home.

The implications for pupils, should they break these rules, can be quite significant and I would really appreciate you reiterating these with your son/daughter.
